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ROME HOTEL: LIKE A PRIVATE APARTMENT

Our **Joan Scobey** recommends **Il Palazzetto** (Vicolo del Bottino 8, ☎ 39-06-6993-4301, www.wineacademyroma.com), an enchanting 4-bedroom villa overlooking Rome's famous Spanish Steps.

This 4-story 16th century building renovated after **Roberto Wirth**, owner of the **Hassler Hotel** (across the street) bought it. Each elegant, AC-bedroom has a marble bathroom, has French windows opening onto a garden. There's also a library-dining room and covered terrace (where lunch and dinner are often served). Bkfst is at the Hassler in its glass enclosed restaurant with dramatic views of Rome. The easiest route between the two hotels is via the rooftop terrace of Il Palazzetto thru a private gate and across the Piazza Trinita dei Monti to the Hassler.

Tip: Check in at the Hassler and a porter will take you and your bags to your Roman villa.

Note: Il Palazzetto is also headquarters of the **Wine Academy of Rome**, whose programs from simple tastings to elaborate events.
